The mission of the center is to partner with the community by providing safe refuge and comprehensive services responsive to the individual needs of women, children and men experiencing domestic violence, sexual assault or child abuse in Bastrop, Colorado, Fayette and Lee counties

FY 2004 TEAM HIGHLIGHTS "Working together to paint a brighter future"

PREVENTION EDUCATION TEAM

Provides school-based child assault prevention programs and education to area youth to prevent child abuse, dating violence, sexual assault and sexual harassment.

- **460** prevention (anti-violence, anti-victimization) presentations were given.
- **4,993** elementary students received presentations.
- **5,711** middle/high school students received presentations.

CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM

Provides crisis intervention 24 hours a day 7 days a week.

- **7,539** hotline calls were answered.
- **1,200** adults and children received crisis intervention services.
- **164** individuals were assisted in the protective order process.
- **277** children received school supplies and **144** families received holiday gifts and food.



COUNSELING TEAM

Provides art and play therapy to adults and children to reduce trauma from sexual assault, domestic violence and child abuse.

- **260** children received art/play therapy in the Self Help Awareness Positive Esteem program.
- **140** adults and teens received counseling to continue their healing process.

SHELTER & HOUSING TEAM

Provides emergency shelter and long term housing for victims of abuse.

- **7,054** nights of shelter to 126 adults and **260** children.
- **12** families received supportive housing.

VIOLENCE INTERVENTION TEAM

Provides educational groups designed to help individuals end their violence to their loved ones and others in the community.

- There were **132** new intakes into the Adult Violence Intervention Program and **92** adults graduated.
- **39** adults participated in the Protective Parenting group.
- **498** domestic violence incidents were reported to the FVIS system by law enforcement in an effort to further ensure that offenders are held accountable.
- Coordinated Community Response Teams: **16** criminal justice personnel and family violence advocates received national training.

VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers worked to help create a safe community for their friends and neighbors.

- **157** volunteers provided over 16,026 hours of support to the Center.

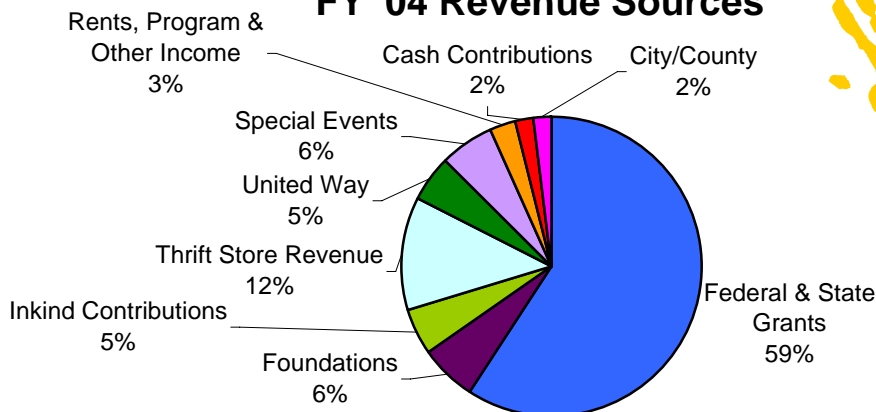
